CCP fines dairy associations for collusive practices

KARACHI: The Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP) has penalised three dairy associations in Karachi for engaging in collusive practices that manipulated fresh milk prices, violating Section 4(1) and 4(2)(a) of the Competition Act, 2010.

The investigation was launched after media reports highlighted a steep surge in milk prices in Karachi. The enquiry revealed that the three associations, operating at different stages of the fresh milk supply chain, played a direct role in the price hike across Karachi and its adjoining areas.

The CCP's findings revealed that these associations influenced key pricing mechanisms, including 'bandhi' rates', 'mandi' rates, wholesale prices, and retail rates. The associations used coercive tactics, such as threatening milk supply suspensions, to enforce compliance with their pricing directives among wholesalers and retailers.

The evidence, including video recordings, demonstrated that price increases announced by the associations were effectively implemented across the supply chain. The order highlighted that the groups created artificial milk shortages by hoarding supplies in ice factories and later selling them at inflated rates in Sindh's rural parts. These practices not only disrupted the supply chain but also imposed a significant financial burden on consumers.

The commission has imposed a Rs1 million fine on the Dairy and Cattle Farmers Association (DCFA) and Rs500,000 each on Dairy Farmer Association Karachi (DFAK) and Karachi Dairy Farmers Association (KDFA).

During the proceedings, the associations argued that the price caps set by the commissioner of Karachi under the Sindh Essential Commodities Price Control and Prevention of Profiteering and Hoarding Act, 2005, had not been revised for three years despite inflationary pressures. However, the CCP concluded that the associations' practices went beyond addressing economic challenges, amounting instead to anti-competitive behaviour aimed at manipulating the market.

At the same time, the CCP's findings demonstrated that these associations exerted undue influence on the supply chain to manipulate milk prices.

The CCP order established that evidence, in the form of video recordings, confirmed that the price increases announced by the associations were effectively implemented across the supply chain.

The associations employed coercive tactics to enforce compliance with their pricing mechanisms, threatening wholesalers and retailers with milk supply suspensions if they refused to adhere to the prescribed rates.

The CCP, in its order, noted that the associations had substantial influence over key pricing elements, including bandhi rates and mandi rates, which are the open market or the retail rates and wholesale market prices, respectively.

The CCP stated that these collusive activities resulted in significant price distortions in the fresh milk market.

Karachi: Three dairy associations fined Rs 2mln for raising milk prices

The Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP) has imposed fines of Rs 2 million on three dairy associations in Karachi for increasing the prices of fresh milk.

According to the media reports, a bench comprising Chairman CCP, Dr. Akbar Sidhu and member Abdul Rashid Sheikh issued an order imposing a fine of Rs 1 million on the Dairy and Cattle Farmers Association, and Rs 500,000 each on the Dairy Farmer Association Karachi and the Karachi Dairy Farmers Association.

It is worth mentioning here that the CCP took notice of media reports and conducted an inquiry into the significant increase in milk prices across Karachi.

The investigation revealed that the three associations representing dairy farmers in Karachi were directly responsible for the increase in milk prices in Karachi and its suburbs.

During the operation, the representatives of the associations took the stand that the prices fixed by Karachi Commissioner under the Sindh Essential Commodities Price Control and Prevention of Profiteering and Hoarding Act, 2005, had not been revised for the last three years despite inflation.

However, according to the commission's report, all the aforementioned associations had increased milk prices by putting unnecessary pressure and obstruction on the milk delivery system.

The CCP announcement stated that the evidence presented before the bench, including video recordings, proved that the prices announced by the associations were practically implemented throughout the supply chain.

These associations forced wholesalers and retailers to adhere to their fixed prices through intimidation and threats of suspension of milk supply.

According to the CCP, the associations exercised significant influence over the key price-setting factors – fixed rates, mandi rates, wholesale and retail prices, which led to distortions in the fresh milk market.

The order further revealed that the dairy farmers' associations stored milk in ice factories to create artificial shortages, and later sold it at inflated prices in interior areas of Sindh.

According to the statement, these tactics severely affected the supply chain and imposed additional financial burdens on consumers.

The prices of milk in Karachi are already very high but the Dairy and cattle farmers are still demanding a significant increase in the price of milk, proposing an additional Rs80 per litre.

According to details, the dairy and cattle farmers, who had previously agreed with the Karachi commissioner to maintain the milk price at Rs220 per liter until December 2024, are now pushing to nullify this agreement and set a higher price.

They are advocating for a revised price of Rs300 per liter, seeking an official notification to endorse this change.
