“CCP Hearing on PTCL-Telenor Merger Continues”

Competition concerns emerge in PTCL’s bid for Telenor

Wateen Telecom and Jazz Telecom voiced strong opposition to the proposed acquisition of Telenor Pakistan by PTCL and its merger with Ufone during a Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP) hearing on Wednesday.

The Phase II Merger Review of PTCL’s planned acquisition of 100 per cent shareholding in Telenor Pakistan and Orion Towers Private Limited is currently underway. The hearing was conducted by CCP Chairman Dr Kabir Ahmed Sidhu, with members Salman Amin and Abdul Rashid Sheikh also in attendance.

The PTCL said in December that it had signed a share purchase agreement with Telenor Pakistan to buy all its shares based on an enterprise value of Rs108 billion (\$380 million). The deal, structured on a cash-free, debt-free basis, is subject to regulatory approvals and customary closing conditions.

The development came as the Norway-based Telenor group has been restructuring its Asian businesses, building bigger units in Thailand and Malaysia via local mergers.

PTCL defends acquisition, highlights its potential to bring about efficiency, economies of scale

During Wednesday’s hearing, Mian Samiud Din, counsel for Wateen Telecom, expressed concerns over PTCL’s dominant role as a wholesale supplier of several backhaul services for cellular mobile operators (CMOs), including Long Distance and International (LDI) services.

He highlighted that PTCL had recently shifted the LDI service for Ufone from Wateen in Balochistan. He warned that following the merger, PTCL might monopolise all LDI business currently held by Telenor.

The CCP was informed that while there are around 20 LDI companies operating in Pakistan, PTCL already commands a 48pc market share. Mr Sami cautioned that PTCL’s position as a dominant player could potentially lead to the foreclosure of its competitors in the LDI business. He emphasised the need to consider all aspects of competition that may be affected by the merger.

Meanwhile, Khalid Ibrahim, the counsel for Jazz Telecom, argued that PTCL's acquisition of Telenor would give it a dominant position in the market and urged the CCP to impose both pre-merger and post-merger conditions to safeguard competition.

Hearing held by CCP on M&A case: Wateen and Jazz advance their arguments

Wateen Telecom Ltd and Jazz telecom presented legal arguments against the acquisition of Telenor Pakistan and its merger with the Ufone at the hearing held here by the Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP).

As the Phase II Merger Review of PTCL's proposed acquisition of 100 percent shareholding in Telenor Pakistan and Orion Towers Private Limited continued on Wednesday.

The hearing was conducted by CCP Chairman, Dr. Kabir Ahmed Sidhu, with the presence of members Salman Amin and Abdul Rashid Sheikh.

PTCL-Telenor acquisition: CCP holds first phase-II merger review hearing

Mian Sami-ud-Din, counsel for Wateen Telecom presenting his case said that PTCL was the wholesale supplier of several backhaul services for the cellular mobile operators (CMOs) including the LDI service.

However, like some previous practice the PTCL has shifted the LDI service for Ufone from Wateen, in Balochistan, and after the proposed merger the PTCL will eventually snatch all the LDI businesses currently held with Telenor.

The CCP hearing was informed that there were around 20 LDI companies operating in the country but the PTCL already had around 48 percent LDI market share, and the dominant player can foreclose its rivals in LDI business.

He emphasised the need to consider all aspects of competition that may be affected by the merger.

A leading telecom operator Wednesday raised concern with the Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP) that the PTCL's acquisition of Telenor could give it a dominant position in the market.

The telecom operator also recommended the CCP that the PTCL should be mandated to provide wholesale, non-discriminatory access to other operators, along with fair terms for active infrastructure, fiber, and spectrum sharing and trading, CCP was further informed on Wednesday.

During the proceedings of Phase-II Merger Review held at the CCP, Jazz Telecom's counsel Khalid Ibrahim argued that PTCL's acquisition of Telenor could give it a dominant position in the market. Therefore, the Commission should impose both pre-merger and post-merger conditions. These conditions could include

requiring the merged entities to allow other mobile operators to roam on their network under mutually negotiated terms.

Jazz Seeks Conditions on PTCL Merger

The Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP) is moving forward with its Phase II Merger Review of Pakistan Telecommunication Company Limited's (PTCL) proposed acquisition of 100% shareholding in Telenor Pakistan (Private) Limited (TP) and Orion Tower Private Limited (OT).

The ongoing review aimed at assessing the merger's potential impact on market competition.

The hearing was chaired by CCP Chairman Dr. Kabir Ahmed Sidhu with members Salman Amin and Abdul Rashid Sheikh present.

In the hearing, Mian Sami-ud-Din represented Wateen Telecom. He raised concerns about the merger's potential impact on competition in key sub-markets. It includes tower co-location, fabrication, and the sale of the Indefeasible Right of Use (IRU).

She stated that it would lead to fostered efficiency, and economies of scale. This contributes to the government's Digital Pakistan initiative by transforming the IT and telecom ecosystem.

The CCP raised pertinent questions to all parties, including the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA), to clarify key issues related to market competition, regulatory compliance, and potential impacts on consumers.

The Commission also requested additional data from PTCL and Telenor to assist in its evaluation of the merger.

The hearing will continue today as the CCP progresses its review of this significant acquisition that could reshape Pakistan's telecom landscape.

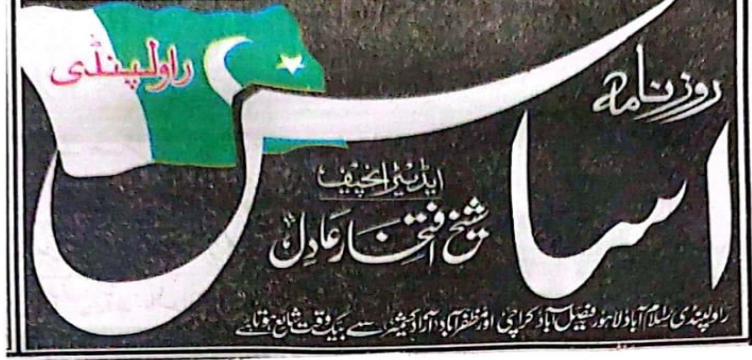

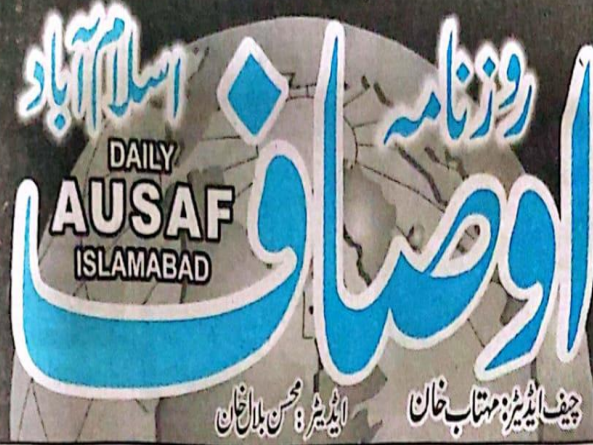

چیز کرتے ہوئے کہا کہ کمیشن کو ٹیلی کام منسٹری ذیلی مارکیٹوں پر اس مرجر کے اثرات کا بھی جائزہ لینا چاہیے۔ جان ٹیلی کام کے وکیل خالد ابراہیم نے دلائل دیتے ہوئے کہا کہ ٹیلی نار کا حصول پی ٹی سی ایل کو مارکیٹ میں بالادست پوزیشن بنا سکتا ہے لہذا کمیشن کو تجویز مرجر کی منظوری دیتے ہوئے کبھی ہر مرجر کی منظوری سے پہلے اور پوسٹ مرجر شرائط عائد کرنی چاہئیں۔ پی ٹی سی ایل کو پابند کیا جائے کہ مرجر کے بعد اسے الٹرا سٹار اور ریٹ ورک پر دیگر موبائل آپریٹرز کو بھی روٹنگ کی اجازت دے جس کے لئے کمپنیاں ہا ہی ملز کرائٹ سے شرائط و ضوابط طے کیا جا سکتی ہیں۔
