The Competition Law 2010 “applies to all undertakings in Pakistan regardless of their public or private ownership,” says its website. “[The law] sets out procedures relating to review of mergers and acquisitions, enquiries, imposition of penalties, grant of leniency and other essential aspects of law enforcement.” The website goes on to add, “Briefly, the law prohibits situations that tend to lessen, distort or eliminate competition such as actions

constituting an abuse of market dominance, competition restricting agreements, and deceptive marketing practices.”
